SPEAKERS

BRIAN BANNON was appointed Commissioner and CEO of the Chicago Public Library (CPL) by Mayor Rahm Emanuel. Under Bannon's award winning leadership, the 140-year-old institution is reimagining traditional services for new audiences and serves as a national model for how large legacy institutions can thrive in the knowledge and information era.

MIKE BECK performs in the United States and Europe as an acoustic guitar solo artist and a highly acclaimed song writer. He has six albums and *Western Horseman Magazine* picked two of his songs to include in "The 13 Best Cowboy Songs" alongside Lucinda Williams and Gene Autry.

DR. ARTHUR BENJAMIN has been repeatedly honored by the Mathematical Association of America for his teaching. He's currently a Professor of Mathematics at Harvey Mudd College and was selected as one of *The Best 300 Professors in America*. He's also a professional magician and lauded as one of the world's fastest mental calculators.

R. SCOTT EVERS received an Emmy and the George Foster Peabody Award for films on America's social ills of youth violence, poverty and HIV/AIDS. He now focuses on media campaigns to stem the tide of youth related violence in Belfast, Northern Ireland in hopes of allowing the ongoing peace process to thrive. He is the author of *Death of a Family*.


PROF. DANIEL FERNANDEZ has been a faculty member at nearby CSUMB for nearly two decades. He teaches physics and classes that address systems thinking, sustainability and infrastructure. One of his research areas is on the collection of water from fog and he and his collaborators have dozens of passive fog water collection sites throughout coastal Northern California. He is also deeply involved with sustainability-related initiatives on campus and within his own life.

MYRA GOODMAN and her husband Drew founded Earthbound Farms in a backyard garden in the Carmel Valley. Both were "city kids" from NYC who became self-taught organic farmers and are credited with popularizing spring mix salads worldwide. Earthbound is now the largest producer of organic produce in North America.















JEFF GREENFIELD has authored or co-authored eleven best-selling books and received three Emmy Awards, but he is best known to millions of viewers for his work as a senior political correspondent and news analyst for CBS, CNN and ABC News.




KEVIN P. HAND studies the physics and chemistry of icy moons in our outer solar system to determine the origin and evolution of our solar planets. Dr. Hand assisted film director James Cameron in his IMAX film *Aliens of the Deep* as well as other oceanic exploration with Cameron.



VICTOR DAVIS HANSON has written or edited twenty-three books. He is a classicist and an expert on the history of war. His recent work is *The Savior Generals: How Five Great Commanders Saved Wars That Were Lost – from Ancient Greece to Iraq*. He was awarded a National Humanities Medal by President George W. Bush.



PROFESSOR G. SCOTT HUBBARD has achievements in space-related research including having served as program director of NASA's first Mars Program, Mars Pathfinder mission, the Lunar Prospector Mission and leading the team that found the exact cause of the tragic Columbia mission. His many honors include NASA's highest award, the Distinguished Service Medal.



DAVID R. IGNATIUS serves as an associate editor and columnist for the *Washington Post* and co-hosts Post Global, an online discussion of international issues with Fareed Zakaria. He is an award winning American journalist and novelist and has written nine novels, including *Body of Lies*, which director Ridley Scott adapted for a film.



PICO IYER authored a dozen books and has been an essayist for Time and The New York Times for twenty-five years. He has also been a multiple Fellow of the World Economic Forum in Davos, a screenwriter for Miramar Films, a biographer of the Dalai Lama and writer of liner notes for Leonard Cohen.

SCOTT JAMES received three Emmy awards for his work in television news, but is best known as a contributor to The New York Times, where he wrote a weekly column about San Francisco. Scott, under the pen name Kemble Scott, is also the author of two bestselling novels, *SoMa* and *The Sower*.

JEFF KIRSCHNER built successful mobile and social media advertising campaigns for Levi's and Sony. But concern for our planet's escalating litter problem led Jeff to create *Litterati.org*, a website encouraging readers to pick up a piece of litter, pictorially document its location and submit it to the Litterati map to develop world wide solutions for environmental clean-up.

DR. JEFF LANGHOLZ is an award-winning teacher, researcher, and entrepreneur with a passion for sustainability. He has 25 years of worldwide experience creating "triple bottom line" solutions that benefit people, planet, and profits. His work has been covered by *The Wall Street Journal, New York Times, The Economist* and more than 250 other media outlets. Jeff has a Ph.D. in Natural Resources from Cornell University, and is a professor of international environmental policy at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies in Monterey, California.

SETH LERER writes and edits on a broad range of subjects from Medieval Literature to children's literature education. He is currently a Professor of Literature at the University of California, San Diego, and has also been a teaching fellow at both Oxford and Cambridge.

GAIL DEXTER LORD co-founded Lord Cultural Resources Planning and Management, the world's largest cultural planning firm. Gail is committed to assisting institutions, communities and their leaders in developing their cultural resources to maximize the public benefit.

JULIE LYTHCOTT-HAIMS believes many adolescents and young adults are on a limited and narrow path which prevents success and personal development. She writes about this issue from the dual vantage points of a former university dean and a parent of two teenagers.













MICHAEL ALEC ROSE composes symphonies and other works which are widely performed in the U.S. and abroad. He is Associate Professor of Composition at Vanderbilt University's Blair School of Music and co-directs the International Exchange Program between the Blair School and the Royal Academy of Music, London.



KARIM SADJADPOUR serves as Senior Associate at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. He was previously an Analyst with the International Crisis Group and is the author of *Reading Khamenei: The World View of Iran's Most Powerful Leader*. He appears frequently on CNN, BBC and NPR.



SUSAN SHILLINGLAW currently serves as Interim Director at the National Steinbeck Center in Salinas and is a Professor of English at San Jose State University. Susan has published widely on John Steinbeck, most recently *Carol and John Steinbeck: Portrait of a Marriage*. She has been teaching and writing about Steinbeck for 28 years.







An accomplished actress herself, she sparks students' interest in Shakespeare by coaching them in abbreviated performances of Romeo and Juliet, as she did earlier this week at the Student Ideas Festival at the Santa Catalina School.



ROBERT M. WACHTER, MD directs the Division of Hospital Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco, where he is also a professor and Interim Chair of the Department of Medicine. He coined the term "hospitalist" which has become the fastest growing comprehensive medical specialty program today.

EDUCATOR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

From the beginning of the *Authors and Ideas Festival* there has been a serious commitment to celebrate those who work tirelessly to educate the youth of Monterey County. More than 2000 weekend scholarship passes have been provided over the years, and countless testimonials show how lessons learned during the Festival make their way back to classrooms throughout our area during each school year.

STUDENT INTRODUCERS

Beginning with the very first *Authors and Ideas Festival* nine years ago, students from Monterey County schools have played an integral role. Students are chosen to research, meet and introduce all of the speakers for the *Festival*. Students also serve as introducers for all presenters during the *Student Ideas Festival* held at Santa Catalina School and attended by 2200 Monterey County middle and high school students each September.

For the first time last year we were proud to have the participation of students representing more than 150 migrant students who participated in Migrant Education Region XVI's annual Speech and Debate Tournament. This group comes from public schools throughout Monterey County, from San Lucas to Castroville. We are very pleased to have members of this group with us again this year to introduce many of our Saturday speakers.

"I HAVE A GREAT IDEA" CONTEST

Now in its third year, participation in this contest is available to all middle and high school students in the county. Students are invited to submit a one-minute video explaining an original great idea. They may work individually or as teams.

Last year's winners, Ian Russell and Nathaniel Avila from Washington Middle School in Salinas, submitted their idea to cross breed the fast growing eastern white pine with the

balsam fir. The resulting hybrid tree would grow faster and be able to produce more paper; hence, leaving more trees to curb global warming. WOW, and this from middle school students!

STUDENT IDEAS FESTIVAL


Over the last two days more than 2000 Monterey County students from twenty five schools attended sessions on the beautiful campus of Santa Catalina School, where they participated in a special performance of Romeo and Juliet and were inspired by a Mars explorer, a young farm worker who became a doctor, the co-founder of the largest organic grower in our country and a water expert, to name a few.

FESTIVAL 2 SCHOOLS

Since it is impossible to bring every Monterey County student to the Student Festival, this program was created to take Festival presenters to schools throughout the academic year. Presentations are given to large assemblies of students, and when a speaker is an author, books are donated to the school.

Last March Festival 2 Schools took Litterati Founder, Jeff Kirschner, to Chalone Peaks Middle School in King City where he spoke to three groups of 250 students each. As a direct result, King City has recently embarked upon a project to clean up the City. The project focuses on creating a litter free world, and schools are challenged to be part of the project.
